The Intermediate show called "Grimm Nights" and the High School Drama production called "Game of Tiaras", were both a success involving many students both on stage and behind the curtain. Thanks to all the students and staff who worked tirelessly to accomplish such a professional show.

In March, over 200 students wrote the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). The test is a graduation requirement and the results will arrive at school in June and the Individual Student Reports will be distributed with the final report cards. Students who were not successful will be contacted by their guidance counsellor.

Save the date! Grade 6 parents, students, and guardians are encouraged to join us on Wednesday, May 9th from 6 -7:30 pm for our Information Night for new students. Students will be given the opportunity to sample various instruments during our "Honk and Blow" session with our music teacher, Mr. Cooper. WEB crew will be on hand to provide tours. Grade 7 and 8 teachers will be available to meet new students. A presentation by our administration will take place in the auditorium. Please join us.

A request made by parents or students to leave before the end of the school year cannot be approved. This includes requests for early departure for summer jobs, summer camps or training, and travel arrangements. Evaluations of student achievement require that all students remain in classes until the course is completed and that includes the completion of all summative evaluations according to the schedule established by SRB and the OCDSB. Summatives are scheduled by classroom teachers before exams begin. Exams will run from June 19 - 24, 2019. We thank you for honouring these time periods.

Some of our grade 12 students have already received acceptances at universities and colleges and they may think they can coast to the end of the school year. However, this is a time for students to renew their focus on academic goals in order to ensure success. These final months require a concentrated effort especially during the final summative and exam period when 30% of the final grade is earned.

At SRB, we are honoured to host two celebrations for our graduates. The Graduation Breakfast and Rehearsal takes place on Tuesday, June 18, 2019. Commencement takes place on Friday, June 28, 2019 at 10:00AM for the graduating class of 2019 and their parents. The number of guests attending is limited to 2-3 per graduate. Commencement invitations are distributed in class in May and there is a cost of \$25 for this event to cover caps, gowns and food. This cost must be paid online. Students needing financial assistance should speak to the Principal.

Prom is the dinner dance and "after party" organized by a student committee who determines the location and the cost. Currently, the dinner/dance is on June 29th at the Hilton Lac Leamy with a cost of \$113 per ticket. The after party will be held at the Ottawa Gatineau Executive Airport with an estimated cost of \$65. These events are not sanctioned by Sir Robert Borden High School. SRB does not participate in any fundraising or advertising, nor do we assume any responsibility or liability for this event. Staff does not assume a supervisory role nor attend any part of the Prom event. We want to make our position very clear so that you are informed and may have appropriate discussions with your graduating student.

Character Education at SRB

On April 15th, high school students at SRB welcomed Eva Olsson, a Holocaust (Shoah) survivor to our auditorium to deliver a powerful message of anti bullying, choosing love over hate,

and what it means to be a good citizen of Canada. At 94 years

young, Eva eloquently talked about the duty of adults and youth to refuse the role of "bystander" and the importance of social



acceptance and peace. SRB students are part of the last generation to hear these stories live and use them to inform their personal paths and legacies. The entire auditorium was respectfully silent and many students and staff noted the impact of her words and stories, some embracing her after her speech. After the assembly, several students who had participated in the March of the Living last year stayed to talk to Eva, ask her questions and express their gratitude for her positive message for youth today.

French Department



On April 5th a group of 63 French immersion students went to the Théâtre La

Catapulte to see the play *Princess de personne*. The play, which focused on themes of consent and gender stereotypes, was appreciated by the students. After the show, students had the opportunity to exchange with the actors and ask them questions about their work, the play and their view of the themes portrayed in the play. 


Phys Ed Department

• *Boys Curling* -NCSSAA Tier 2 Champions


Celebrate. Remember. Fight Back.
